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# 1. Introduction and Highlights

## 1.1. About the Program

Clinician researchers are well placed to identify research opportunities of great relevance to the health care of our patients and its delivery. The Clinician Researcher Fellowships (the Fellowships) are available to Gold Coast Health clinical staff, providing an opportunity to develop their clinical research careers while remaining clinically active, by contributing to high-quality research, supporting its translation and contributing to improved healthcare delivery.

Through the opportunity to develop research career pathways, the program aims to attract and retain skilled and promising early career researchers. Staff with a Research Higher Degree (RHD) (PhD, MPhil, or MD by thesis) within 10 years of the fellowship application closing date.

The Fellowship will provide Fellows with up to 0.4 FTE research time of three year's duration to further their research career, support a research active culture, develop and undertake a body of research in areas of existing strength, working towards national and international recognition.

There are up to two Fellowships available in 2027 (if suitable based on merit). The Fellowship program will be open to clinical staff across all disciplines, with a maximum of one for Senior Medical Officers.

Applicants must be an early career clinician researcher and hold a clinical position of at least 0.4 FTE at Gold Coast Health.

## 2. Program Objectives

Gold Coast Health is committed to setting a forward-looking research agenda which embraces novel approaches to diagnostics and therapeutics, as well as systematically evaluating our clinical practice and the implementation of new knowledge to deliver world class healthcare.

The Gold Coast Health [Research Roadmap 2025-2028](#) outlines a vision that our research transforms health, with our purpose to advance high-quality research to address our health priorities, leading to improved patient care. The Clinician Researcher Fellowships program will enable our clinicians to concurrently advance their research and clinical practice careers, and develop a program of research aligned to this vision and purpose and the priorities of the broader Gold Coast Health [Strategic Plan 2024-2028](#) (G28).

The key objectives of the Clinician Researcher Fellowships program are to:

- Support and develop research excellence in early career clinician researchers who are embedded within Gold Coast Health.
- Promote enhanced opportunities for diverse career pathways by attracting and retaining our early career clinician researchers.
- Expand early career clinician researcher capacity in a supportive and appropriately supervised, research-enabling environment.
- Enable capacity building, early career clinician researcher mentoring, and the continued development of leadership and supervision capabilities that aligns with Gold Coast Health's [Values](#) and the broader Gold Coast Health [Strategic Plan 2024-2028](#) (G28).
- Applications are invited from clinicians across all healthcare disciplines, including allied health services, nursing, health sciences, dental, medical.

## 3. Grant Funding and Support

### 3.1. Funding

There are up to two Fellowships available in 2027 (if suitable based on merit). The Fellowship program will be open to clinical\* staff across all disciplines, with a maximum of one for Senior Medical Officers.

The Fellowship will provide up to 0.4 FTE of three years' duration. Applicants must hold a clinical position (undertaking clinical duties\*) of at least 0.4FTE at Gold Coast Health for the duration of their Fellowship.

\*Please note:

- The total concurrent employment arrangement with Gold Coast Health does not have to equate to 1.0 FTE, but cannot exceed 1.0 FTE.
- Clinical staff/ Clinician is defined as a health professional with a recognised tertiary degree, with eligibility or membership with a relevant professional body.
- Clinical duties refers to those duties undertaken by the applicant in the course of their employment as a clinician. These duties may be directly related to patient care or may include non-clinical duties such as administrative or management specialisation.

## 3.2. Support from Gold Coast Health Research Office

### Preparation of Application

Applicants can attend a Research Office drop-in clinic, which are held in the Gold Coast University Hospital Library, Level 1, E Block, Pathology and Education Building on a Tuesday morning at 7am (Book an appointment here: [Gold Coast Health Research Office - Book an Appointment](#)) or a Thursday afternoon 2:00pm – 4:00pm (walk in only session) for assistance with protocols, budget preparation, statistics, ethics and governance.

Applicants are encouraged to access **research career development resources** to identify their strengths in research, translation, and leadership and plan development within their clinical department, across Gold Coast Health and the wider research and clinical community. One research career development framework relevant to a health service research environment is the [Queensland Health Allied Health Research Careers Development Framework](#). The Framework and accompanying Individual Assessment Tool helps clinicians assess capabilities across core domains and support career discussions with managers, research mentors and early career researchers.

If an applicant's program of research includes **digital ideas or technology components** (e.g. AI, software, data, or system integration), please engage with the Digital Health and Innovation (DHI) Division to ensure alignment with technical, cybersecurity, and infrastructure requirements. DHI can help identify risks, clarify integration requirements, and highlight opportunities to leverage existing systems, strengthening implementation planning.

### Successful Applicants

The Gold Coast Health Research Office will offer support to Fellows for the duration of the grant program. This support will include structured training experiences (online and in person) delivered in partnership with academic partners or one-to-one consultations designed to strengthen research impact for Fellows across all stages of the research lifecycle, including project design, statistical analysis, ethics and governance processes, funding development, and dissemination.

## 4. Eligibility

To be eligible for a Clinician Researcher Fellowship, applicants must:

- Be employed in a clinical role with Gold Coast Health for the duration of the Fellowship, appointed to a minimum of 0.4 FTE clinician duties, as per the definition above.
- The total Gold Coast Health appointment must not exceed 1.0 FTE. Note: the total concurrent employment arrangement with Gold Coast Health does not have to equate to 1.0 FTE.
- The Fellowship program will be open to clinical staff across all disciplines and will provide up to 0.4 FTE of three years' duration.
- To be eligible, evidence of completion of a Research Higher Degree (aka RHD and including PhD, MPhil, or MD by thesis) within 10 years of the fellowship application closing date (evidence must be provided). If a RHD thesis is imminent or under examination, applications may be considered if the RHD is conferred by 1 March 2027.

- Shortlisted applicants must be available to attend the face-to-face panel interview session on the week commencing 15 February 2027.

## 5. Conditions of Funding

### 5.1. Funding Use

**What can be funded:**

- Fellowships will provide funding support (i.e. salary costs) for up to 0.4 FTE annually (but not less than 0.2 FTE) for three years.
- Fellows will either be concurrently appointed to a temporary part-time position at the level of their current substantive clinician appointment within Gold Coast Health or funds will be transferred to their existing position to enable up to 0.4 FTE of time to be allocated to the Fellowship.
- Fellowship research time can be used to develop an individualised research training plan on commencement of their Fellowship. It is expected that this plan demonstrates how the Fellow intends on participating in relevant research training (e.g. training provided through academic partners, and building on a baseline of training already completed).
- Complete Good Clinical Practice (GCP) training. Submission of a certificate of completion will be required prior to disbursement of funding.
- Undertake a body of research aligned with the Gold Coast Health [Strategic Plan 2024 - 2028 \(G28\)](#) and [Local Area Needs Assessment](#) and undertaken at, or significantly associated with, Gold Coast Health facilities and/or research which involves preventative or community work that will directly impact Gold Coast Health service delivery and the wider community.
- Build broader research capacity and seek external research funding opportunities related to their Fellowship project.
- Demonstrate adherence to the research plan outlined in the approved application, and continuation of Fellowship funding is contingent upon successful progress toward completion of these activities.

- Participate in a regular six-monthly Executive Sponsor check-in with the Gold Coast Health Chair of Research to discuss progress (including but not limited to research leadership, mentoring, collaboration opportunities, progress with external grant opportunities)
- Prepare an Annual Progress Report.
- Be active in applying for external research funding related to their Fellowship project during their Fellowship (and provide evidence).

## 6. Application Process

### 6.1. Application

The application must be submitted by the advertised closing date using the required [SmartyGrants](#) online application form (extensions will not be granted).

Applications missing required information, evidence, documentation, signatures or exceeding the word limits, will not be considered.

## 6.2. Submitting an application

Once the grant round is open applications must be completed via the [SmartyGrants](#) online platform. Applicants should follow the prompts to login and create an account (if no account exists). When the account is created, applicants can refer to the Help Hub for the [Help Guide for Applicants](#), and the [Applicant FAQ](#).

Once the application has commenced, ensure it is regularly **'saved'** to avoid losing any work due to timeouts. Save again after each session to ensure the application is updated. Applications can be saved at any point within the application form to return later. Once 'submitted', applicants will be unable to make further edits, you will, however, be able to **view** the application.

Submit the application using the requisite online application form ensuring:

- all requisite documents are uploaded according to content and formatting requirements.
- ensure that all requisite certifications and signatures are obtained on the certification page of the application form, including the following representatives:
  - Applicant
  - Head of Department
  - Primary Supervisor
  - Executive Director

*Note: Once you have completed the application, please download a PDF copy but do not submit the online form at this stage. Attach the PDF copy to the certification template provided and circulate for required signatures. Once the certification page has been fully executed, upload with the PDF of the application into the application form. Once uploaded, you can 'submit' the application.*

## 7. Assessment Process

### 7.1. Assessment Criteria

Applications will be assessed by the Clinician Researcher Fellowships Panel (the Panel) using the following criteria:

### 7.2. Review Process

Members of the Fellowship Review Panel will review each application (after considering potential conflicts of interest).

The Fellowship Review Panel will be Chaired by the Gold Coast Health Chair of Research and will include clinical researchers, members of academic partner organisations and a consumer representative.

Each application will be scored (1-7) under each of the four criteria above and then scores converted to a criterion score (between 20-30% for each) and totaled to 100. Reviewers will be requested to score each of the four criteria below.

Grade	Category	Description
7	Outstanding	Fully addresses all assessment criteria to an outstanding and exceptional by nationally competitive standard and presents an outstanding argument for selection.
6	Excellent	Addresses all outlined assessment criteria to an excellent standard and makes a compelling argument for selection.
5	Very good	Addresses most outlined assessment criteria to a very good (above average to high) standard and makes a strong case for consideration.
4	Good	Meets the outlined assessment criteria to an acceptable standard and presents a sound proposal for consideration.
3	Below average	Addresses only some of the outlined assessment criteria and the case for consideration is weak or poorly formulated.
2	Marginal	Does not sufficiently address the outlined assessment criteria and presents no case for consideration.
1	Unsatisfactory	Does not address any of the selection criteria and is not satisfactory for consideration.

Following assessment by the Panel, short-listed applicants will be recommended and invited for interview.

Those applicants who are unsuccessful and do not progress to an interview will receive written confirmation via email from the Chair of Research not less than one week prior to the scheduled interview date.

## Interviews

Invitations will be received by phone and email not less than one week prior to the scheduled interview. Applicants are requested to invite their Head of Department, Clinical Supervisor or Executive delegate to attend.

### Please note:

- Timeslots will be allocated, and applicants are expected to be available at the requested time.
- Acceptance must be confirmed by return email. A request for a change in time only may be made. Requests are not guaranteed and will only be made subject to panel availability.
- Should an applicant decline or be unavailable to interview, they will not be eligible for the current round and the next-highest ranked applicant may be invited to interview.

- Interviews will be held at Gold Coast University Hospital, and in-person attendance is required.
- The interview will be attended by the Chair of Research (Panel Chair), members of the review panel, the applicant and their Head of Department or delegate (if unavailable).
- The Head of Department or Executive delegate attending the interview will be asked to speak to the level of potential impact, project feasibility and support of the applicant.

## 7.3. Decisions

### Outcomes and Award

The Fellowship panel will convene to determine a recommendation following completion of the interviews. The Fellowship panel will then prepare a recommendation for noting to the Gold Coast Health Study, Education, Research Trust Account (SERTA) Committee with a final decision by the Chief Medical Officer, Medical Services, Clinical Governance and Research (MSCGR) and the Chief Financial Officer. The Executive Research Committee will be provided with the outcome of the recommendations for information.

Successful candidates will receive an offer and will be requested to undertake formal negotiations with their proposed academic partner and confirm arrangements with their Head of Department and Executive Director. Upon award, Fellows will receive the following:

- Letter of Confirmation.
- Fellowship Agreement to be signed by the Fellow, outlining the Terms and Conditions of the award, including compliance with all relevant policies, procedures, legislation and regulatory frameworks relating to the conduct and management of research.
- Confirmation of Fellowship Arrangement form to be signed by the Fellow and their Director.

Outcomes are anticipated to be announced at the Research, Innovation and Transformation Showcase on 4 March 2027 (TBC).

## 8. Contractual Arrangements

### 8.1. General/ Funding Agreement

Fellows must adhere to the following conditions outlined in the Funding Agreement, including:

- Fellows must take up the appointment within six months of acceptance of the Terms and Conditions of the Fellowship Agreement and Fellowship Arrangement, except where granted special permission to do otherwise.
- Fellows and their Directors should give early consideration to any back-fill requirements to ensure these are in place prior to commencement of the agreed Fellowship term.
- It is the Fellow's responsibility to ensure full ethical approval (Human Research Ethics Committee approval) and governance authorisation (Site Specific Authorisation) is received for all research undertaken during the Fellowship.
- The Fellow will be responsible for demonstrating adherence to the research plan outlined in the approved application, and continuation of Fellowship funding is contingent upon successful progress toward completion of these activities. Fellows will be monitored via the check-in and their Annual Progress Report.

- Where the application includes a proposed collaboration with an academic partner, the applicant must also demonstrate agreement from the academic partner to meet the minimum expectations in Fellowship support, including both in-kind and infrastructure support.

## 8.2. Dissemination and Publicity

It is a condition of the Fellowship agreement that the Fellow will cooperate in any reasonable public relations requests or forums as a research ambassador to promote research including the annual Research, Innovation and Transformation Showcase, Research Grand Rounds, internal and external communications. The Fellow will also act as an advocate for clinician researchers at Gold Coast Health and become a member of the Gold Coast Health Advancing Research Alliance.

### Appropriate recognition of the Fellowship

Recipients must acknowledge the support of the Fellowship in reports, publications and presentations associated with the funded research as follows:

**This work was supported by the Gold Coast Health Clinician Researcher Fellowships program**

It is the responsibility of the Fellow to ensure that copies or links to all published articles, preprints and conference abstracts are provided to the Research Office via the Grants Administrator as soon as they become available.

### Participation in promotion, monitoring, and evaluation of the scheme

- Fellows may be contacted to provide information or attend events to:
  - present outcomes and updates of progress of the funded research at events, including research-related symposiums at Gold Coast Health or partner organisations, or
  - raise the profile of the research work or CRGS through internal or external Communications opportunities.
- The Fellow is expected to proactively communicate and disseminate project outcomes, including working with the Research Office and Strategic Communications.

## 8.3. Confidentiality and Privacy / Intellectual Property Rights

Recipients must adhere to the Gold Coast Health [Intellectual Property Policy \(Document ID POL1283\)](#) and comply with any amendments and adhere to the clauses detailed in the Funding Agreement. Please refer to the Policy for the definition of “Intellectual property”. Ownership and the associated rights of all Intellectual Property generated because of funded research will initially be vested in Gold Coast Health, unless otherwise agreed.

Where funded research involves a collaboration between Gold Coast Health and one or more academic partners, conjoint employees or students, the Intellectual Property generated may be vested as agreed between the participating institutions. This will be negotiated through preparation of Funding Agreements.

## 8.1. Administration of Funds

- Fellowship recipients will be provided clinical backfill for the dedicated research time allocated to the Clinician Researcher Fellowship program for the duration of Fellowship term being **three years**
- The Fellowship recipient may only use funding provided under this program to fund salary costs up to 0.4 FTE in line with the program of research as described in the application. Funding to conduct the research as described in the research plan must be sourced separately.

- A Funding Agreement will be provided to the applicant for execution, and a Confirmation of Fellowship Arrangement must also be signed by the Clinical Director / Head of Department.
- A dedicated Fellowship ION will be created under a cost centre within the operational area of the Fellowship recipient. The Fellowship recipient is encouraged to work closely with their line manager to ensure correct management of Fellowship funds to salary.
- Fellowship recipients will be provided with funding upon execution of the Funding Agreement or upon commencement of an agreed Fellowship commencement date (within six months of award).
- The Fellowships are awarded for a maximum of **three years**, with extensions only allowable via an approved variation request made to the Grants Administrator [grantsgoldcoast@health.qld.gov.au](mailto:grantsgoldcoast@health.qld.gov.au)
